

REQUIRED PHOTO VIEWS

Photographs must clearly depict the current condition of the property. The number of views needed varies according to the complexity of the property. Prints of historic photographs may supplement documentation and may be particularly useful in cases where alterations make a property's historic integrity questionable. Submit historic images on the continuation sheet.
